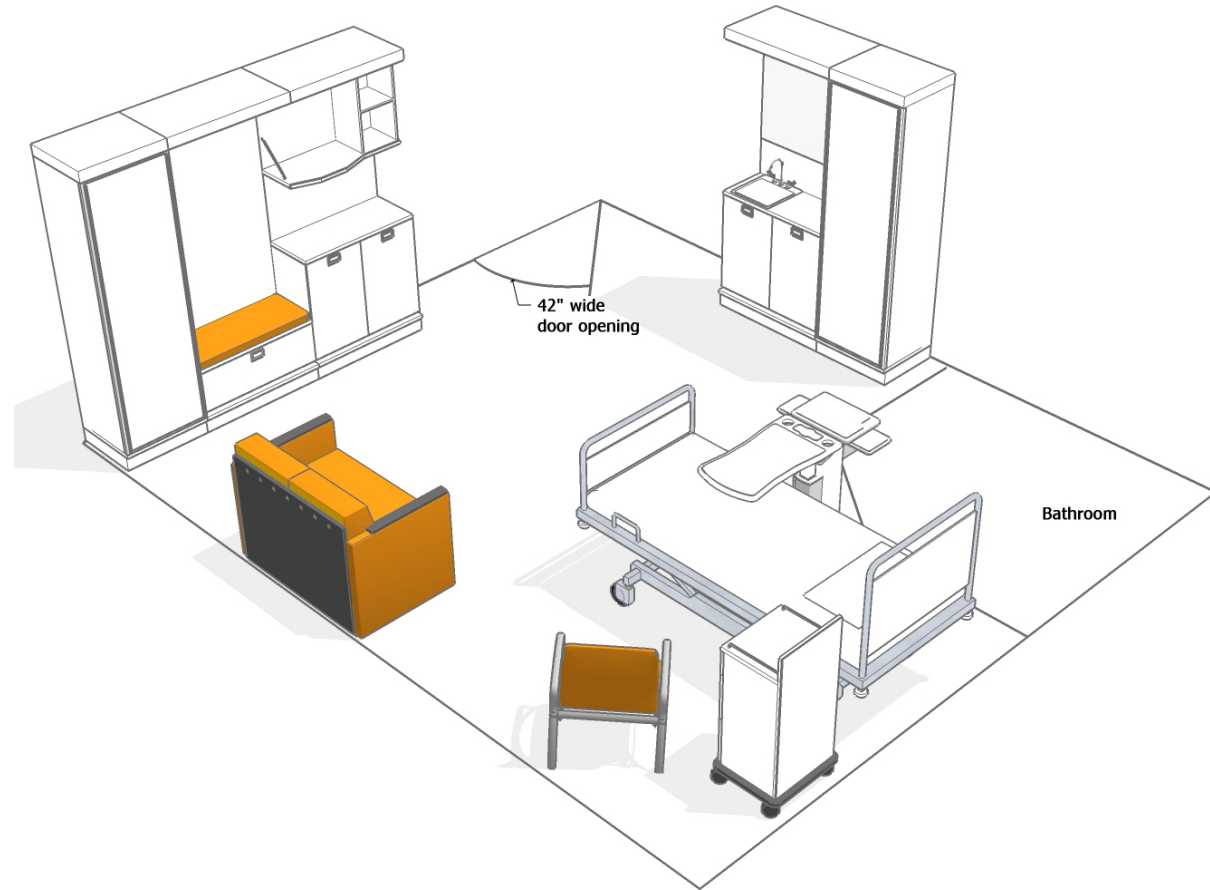

## User Experience

Create zones that support the needs of the three primary users: patient, caregiver, and partner in care.  
 Lighting should meet the comfort needs of the patient and the work requirements of the staff, especially at night.  
 Provide space at the threshold of the patient room for staff activities like charting or preparing meds.  
 Elements in the room like the overbed table or bedside table can provide patients with a sense of control over their environment.

Overall comfort supports visitors, which can enhance patient comfort and healing.
